The article presents a theoretical justification of modern approaches to neurocorrection as a conceptual foundation for overcoming stuttering in children. It identifies the methodological principles and outlines the potential for integrating technologies into the formation of correctional programs, which determined the purpose of the study. The research methods include theoretical analysis and synthesis of scientific sources on the issue, comparison of neurocorrection approaches, and systematization and generalization of the obtained data. The methodological basis of the study is an interdisciplinary approach that combines the principles of neuropsychology, cognitive psychology, speech therapy, and psychophysiology, as well as the concept of brain neuroplasticity as a basis for speech transformation. The results reveal that current views on childhood stuttering are based on a multifactorial concept encompassing neurobiological, psychophysiological, sociolinguistic, and psycho-emotional factors. У статті розглянуто питання онлайн-ресурсів для мовної практики у підготовці фахівців сфери туризму. ТЕОРЕТИКО-ПЕДАГОГІЧНІ АСПЕКТИ ФОРМУВАННЯ МЕДІАПСИХОЛОГІЧНОЇ БЕЗПЕКИ КУРСАНТІВ

У статті здійснено теоретичне обтрунтування поняття «медіапсихологічна безпека». Акцентовано увагу на зростаючій актуальності цього феномену в контексті підготовки майбутніх офіцерів в умовах сучасних інформаційних викликів, зважаючи на агресивний характер гібридної війни та постійний психологічний тиск через медіапростір. Автори наголошують на необхідності виокремлення поняття «медіапсихологічна безпека», розкриваючи його відмінності від таких понять, як, наприклад, «інформаційна безпека», «кібербезпека», «медіаграмотність». В роботі «медіапсихологічна безпека» представлена як стан захищеності психіки особистості від деструктивного та маніпулятивного впливу медіаінформації, що забезпечується її розвиненою медіаграмотністю, критичним мисленням, психологічною стійкістю до інформаційних викликів та здатністю до свідомої інформаційної гігієни, що в сукупності сприяє підтримці психологічного благополуччя в умовах інтенсивного медіапростору.

Особливу увагу приділено класифікації факторів медіапсихологічного впливу на курсантів. Так, автори виокремлюють такі групи факторів: група факторів, що створюють педагогічні виклики для розвитку критичного мислення; група факторів, що впливають на освітній процес та увагу; група факторів, що впливають на мотивацію та цінності; група факторів, що надають педагогічні можливості. В межах кожної групи виділені окремі фактори, які проаналізовані через призму педагогічних викликів та педагогічних завдань, які повинна враховувати та вирішувати сучасна освіта. На думку авторів завдяки наданій класифікації педагоги зможуть цілеспрямовано обирати та впроваджувати найбільш доцільні педагогічні стратегії, добирати технології та методи. Такий підхід є ключовим для підготовки майбутніх офіцерів, які мають бути психологічно стійкими та надійно захищеними від інформаційних загроз.
